

What are the Basic Rights at work?

Labor law and how you can learn

If you live in *Indiana*, then you want to look at the laws that are specific to Indiana. **There are some laws that are federal** and there are many others who are at the state level.

After having used the Internet to learn the basic labor law a bit in your area, you can go to your local library for more information. **The library has several books of law which can help you** find what you need, and the employer must have posters and information about the various laws.

Another place to find information is a **lawyer**, and if you have in your family, or you can talk about anything you need, you can find some information. This includes discussions with the *EEOC*. Need information on labor law and gender that have to do with it. They also have basic information on many other labor laws that can help you.

Find a job in the base of the hand of labor law

If your employer has a **human resources department**, you can find some information from there. You should be able to *answer questions* and *offer seminars or training courses* that help you understand the fundamental law of work, **especially for your region** to understand. This can be very useful, and some employers offer salary for this kind of training.

Check with your employer to see what can be done to understand the fundamental laws that work best for your area. This is the first place to start, and when they offer training, you need to register in order to pass through it. If you want more information, you can use the *Internet*, your *local library* or even the *EEOC* or an *attorney* to help you learn about the fundamental law of work.
